2023 - 2024 Impact

During the 2023 - 2024 SY, Playworks Minnesota served 19,310 students across 50 schools and youth organizations in the Twin Cities Metro Area.

Students demographics, 80% Students of Color, 17% English Language Learners, 73% Low Income, & 12% Special Education.

What Research Says About Our Impact

TIER 1 INTERVENTION: Highest Level of Evidence

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

Playworks is a Tier 1 Intervention under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), the Federal Education Law, backed by evidence from controlled study, as affirmed by the RAND Corp Review in 2017. We have 12 published studies and articles that demonstrate our impact.

TIER 1 **CONTROLLED STUDY** by Stanford University

PLAYWORKS SCHOOLS HAVE

LESS BULLYING Teachers in Playworks schools reported significantly less bullying and exclusionary behavior during recess*, a 43% difference in average rating scores.



STUDENTS FEEL SAFER AT SCHOOL

Playworks teachers' average rating of students' feelings of safety at school was 20% higher than the average ratings reported by teachers in control schools!.



STUDENTS ARE ENGAGED IN MORE VIGOROUS PHYSICAL ACTIVITY

Accolorometer data showed that children in Playworks schools spent significantly more time in vigorous physical activity at recess* (14% versus 10% of recess time, which is a 43% difference)*.



STUDENTS ARE READY TO LEARN

MINUTES

Teachers in Playworks schools reported spending significantly less time to transition from recess to learning activities (34% fewer minutes)*.

What Research Says About Our Impact

PLAYWORKS INCREASES ATTENDANCE

When school is fun, kids want to be there.



An independent evaluation by Stanford University found that the Playworks led to a statistically significant increase in attendance among elementary school children. That increase was greatest among chronically absent students.¹



Attendance Works recognizes Playworks as one of a select few programs with research-proven success in improving attendance and reducing chronic absenteeism. Featured in the "Portraits of Change" report, Playworks fosters a positive, inclusive school climate, ensuring students are present, engaged, and prepared for long-term success.²

PLAYWORKS LEVERAGES PLAY TO IMPACT MENTAL HEALTH Strong Relationships, Sense of Belonging, Community at School



88% of teachers reported an increase in students' sense of belonging at school (Playing Fair)⁵

Junior Coaches showed statistically significant positive change in building their sense of bonding at the school (HSAR)⁴



Students are 5x more likely to have a positive interaction with an adult on the playground³

Playworks Junior Coaches (4th and 5th grade leaders) showed statistically significant positive change in building relationships with adults and peers⁴
